Melodic Jazz Improvisation

- 1. Listen- you will understand and grasp a lot from listening to as much jazz as possible.
  - a. Listen to all instruments not just your own.
  - b. Listen to lots of different styles of music and different styles of jazz
- 2. Learn and play as many melodies as possible
  - a. learn first to sing the melodies-learn the words
  - b. play the melody
- 3. What makes a good melody?
  - a. Step wise movement with an occasional leap
  - b. Melodies use repeating elements
  - c. An octave and a half range
  - d. Incorporate a climactic moment
- 4. Learn the form of the tune
- 5. Practice scales, chords, patterns and segments
  - a. Practicing these things help you become proficient on your instrument
  - b. Be able to identify scale notes
- 6. Memorize Licks these things will help build your jazz vocabulary
- 7. Call and response
- 8. Transcribe solos
- 9. Fake books, play alongs and recordings
- 10. Analyze other players -not only their solos but their style
- 11. Practice articulations and variations
  - a. copy your favorite players articulations
- 12. Learn Contra -facts to jazz tunes
- 13. Start a small group out of your big band
  - a. There are more opportunities to improvise and play in a small group than in a big band
- 14. Learn the history of jazz
- 15. Incorporate improvising jazz in your daily warm up
- 16. Clark Terry said ...... Imitate(copy ideas) -Assimilate (gather all the information you can)-Innovate-(you can't create new the things for the most part until you have learned the old things-there are some exceptions.)
